The Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation Awards \$100,000 to The Children's Museum of Atlanta

The Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation has awarded a two-year, \$100,000 grant to [Imagine It! The Children's Museum of Atlanta](#) to support two community-based outreach programs, [Connected Learning...Connected Communities](#) and [Access It!](#)

[Connected Learning...Connected Communities](#) takes hands-on programming directly to children from birth to age in five Atlanta neighborhoods (Pittsburgh, Adair Park, Mechanicsville, Vine City and English Avenue). The in-depth, fun, educational program works with the influential people in a child's life, from parents to school to neighborhood.

[Access It!](#) provides free and reduced museum admission to low-income families and Title I schools. The program increases access to high-quality early learning experiences for low-income children, in school settings or with their families. It also provides an experience that can strengthen family bonds and provide a safe environment for play and learning. Like children's museums throughout the world, Imagine It! exists to support the very simple, but profound truth, that children learn through play.

The museum offers children the opportunity to use all of their senses in a unique and interactive way, while developing their knowledge and understanding of Reading, Social Studies, Math, Science, Language, and the Arts. Together, these programs typically reach more than 28,000 children annually. They provide educational visits to participating schools and childcare centers. The activities include the donation of curriculum and other learning tools, teacher training sessions, and Art and Science workshops, as well as, play and learn sessions for children and their families.

"The Children's Museum of Atlanta is delighted to be collaborating with The Arthur M. Blank Foundation," said Jane Turner, the Museum's executive director. "Museum outreach and community partnerships ensure that children of all backgrounds and abilities find ways to play and learn about the world in which we live."

"As leaders in early childhood education, children's museums engage infants, toddlers, and children through play to think critically and creatively. Exhibits and programs provide children with tangible interactions that challenge them to accomplish small and large feats."
